This piece is my first time digitally manipulating a photo using Adobe Photoshop so most of this piece was experimenting with different tools. I was inspired by The Happy Donor by Rene Magritte and The Persistence of Memory by Salvador Dali.

This project is exploring myself and the community I live in. The medium is acrylic paints on canvas. My inspiration for the piece was Claude Monet and his use of texture, color, and light. Meanwhile, I was inspired by Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec and their use of line color and texture in their pieces. I used a few different types of medium I haven't used like gouache and watercolor pencils as well as used illustration boards and colored pencils. I was inspired by Caspar David Friedrich with Two Men Contemplating the moon, Edward Hopper and his painting automat as well as Edwardes Much with Finger on the Beach.

Title: Overgrown Size: 8 x 11 inches Medium: Photography, Digital Manipulation Exhibition Text:

In this project, I want to explore the city of Milwaukee and its more abandoned areas or worn-down areas. I used a phone camera to capture a lot of pictures from many different locations. My Inspiration for this project was William Christenberry his haunting images of the rural south. My intention for this piece was to take landscape pictures of older or rural structures.

Title: Self Portrait in Pastel Size: 19 x 15 inches Medium: Pastel, Sanded Paper Exhibition Text:

This pastel piece is a self-portrait made using NuPastels and soft pastels on sanded paper painted green as a base. This piece is an accumulation of what I have learned over three weeks of the course on drawing figures. In this piece, I was inspired by Mary Cassatt and her use of optical mixing along with the use of lines to create movement and build up depth in her drawings.

Title: The Dead Man Size: 13 x 24 inches Medium: Pastels, Canson Paper Exhibition Text:

This piece and its pose of the model as well as the set were inspired by Theodore Gericault's Raft of Medusa and was created at MIAD studio for a three-week pre-college program. This piece was made using pastel both soft and hard pastels on a piece of black Canson paper. In this pose, we are trying to create a similar atmosphere to the raft of the medusa by adding props shush as the skeleton prop and wooden bench.

Title: Fairy Forest Size: 15 x 12 inches Medium: Illustration Board, Micron Pens, Watercolor Exhibition Text:

I was initially inspired by the folktales of fairies, mostly the older rendition of fairies where they were depicted as more mischievous and powerful beings. This idea was what led me to look at the artist Alphonse Mucha for his distinct stylized posters such as his poster *Reverie* and *Calendar of Cherry Blossom*.
